Open

What is "Open"?

- "Open"
 - Open Source software: Free Software / FOSS
 - Open hardware
 - Open data
 - Open standards
 - Open processes
 - Open knowledge

"Open washing"

Software

- Open Source
 - OSD: Open Source Definition by OSI
 - Ten criteria

- Free Software
 - Free Software Definition by FSF
 - Four Freedoms
 - Run; Study and change; Redistribute; Redistribute modified





What has to be "Open"?

Software

- Two distinct pieces
 - Model architecture
 - Inference
- The only "known" part, same as "traditional"
- Are both needed?

Training data

- More important than software
- Under open licenses?
- "Fair use"

Weights

- Simply numbers
 - Copyrightable?

- Modifiable?
 - "Preferred mode for modification"

Current "open" systems

- Inference software under FOSS license
- Training software often under FOSS license
- Weights under custom licenses
 - Typically allow redistribution
 - Often restrict use
 - Initially very malformed custom licenses
- Training data
 - Texts (books, ...)
 - Provenance legally dubious
 - Source code (FOSS)
 - Disregard license

Legal basis

- Nothing known
- Nothing decided (yet)
- Many lawsuits in progress
 - Mainly about training data: use, acquisition, ...
- Anthropomorphizing AI does not help
- No legal framework (yet?)
 - Some countries (jurisdictions) are thinking about "innovating"
- Wait and see...

Community understanding

- Definitely no consensus
- Various efforts to define "Open AI"
 - Open Source Initiative (OSI)
 - Published Open Source AI Definition (OSAID v1)
 - Linux Foundation (LF)
 - Free Software Foundation (FSF)

More time (and work) needed

How will it play out?

More time and work needed

VS

- Market push to "Everything AI"
 - "Move fast and break things" or "Don't Be Evil"
 - "Release early and ignore everything"
- "Too big to fail"?
- Abolishment of copyright?

Does it matter?

"Participants warned that the growing use of AI has given rise to new risks and ethical considerations related to bias, transparency, privacy, and existential threats to humanity. [...] The consensus is that openness in AI provides a better pathway to addressing Al's weaknesses and challenges."
